Acme Packet Founder and CEO Andy Ory and telecommunications industry veteran Robert Degan have both agreed to serve on the company's Advisory Board. They will join Paul DeLacey, who has served as an Advisor for the past year.

Andy Ory has been a telecommunications innovator for fifteen years. He is the founder and CEO of Acme Packet, the world's leading supplier of Session Border Controllers, an essential element for Quality of Service (QoS) in VoIP networks. He was previously the founder, CEO, and Chairman of Priority Call Management, a Boston-based company that produced network-based solutions for prepaid calling, enhanced messaging, and one number services. Mr. Ory managed the successful acquisition of PCM by the LHS Group in 1999.

Mr. Degan has served as CEO and Director of several technology companies. He was Chairman, President and Chief Executive Officer of Summa Four, which merged with Cisco Systems in 1998. He then became General Manager for the Enhanced Services & Migration Unit for Cisco Systems. He also served as President, CEO and Director Tylink Corporation (1989-1996), Amnet, Inc. (1985-1989), Data Switch Corporation (1983-1985), Applied Digital Data Systems (1977-1983), and Periphonics Corporation (1974-1977). Mr. Degan is currently a director of Metrobility Optical Systems, Flexi International Software, Overland Data, Abacus America, and Caminosoft Corporation. Earlier in his career he served on the research staff at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT).

Paul DeLacey was the President and CEO of Prodigy, which he helped acquire from IBM and Sears in 1996. He managed the transition from a proprietary online service

provider to a full Internet based service offering and oversaw the development and introduction of Prodigy Internet. Mr. DeLacey is credited with Prodigy's financial turnaround and successful IPO. Subsequently, the business was sold to SBC. Previously, he served as President and CEO of International Wireless and COO of Boston Technology. He also spent twenty years at Honeywell, the last several in executive positions. Mr. DeLacey currently also serves on the Board of Directors of Entaire Global, an Atlanta based financial services company and the Executive Board of Gazelle TechVentures, and is heavily involved with the Carr Foundation, on a philanthropic endeavor in Africa.
